She has been celebrated for being a guide and translator, walking eight thousand miles with her baby on her back, and saving the lives of the 33 men on the expedition, including her husband. However, it is important to note that Sacagawea's "husband" was a French trapper that she was enslaved to when she was 12 or 13. Moreover, for much of history, Sacagawea's achievements were downplayed, as was the fact that she never received compensation for her work.
